GATE Information

Fremont Unified School District (FUSD) provides support for gifted and talented (GATE) students through differentiated instruction.

We believe that differentiated instruction not only serves the needs of our exceptional students, but also enhances the entire educational program for all students.

In February of 2020, funding for the CogAT testing was cut as part of the budget savings. While the CogAT testing has been the primary means of qualifying students for GATE identification we are now in the process of identifying an alternative way of identifying students. **There will not be a test for GATE eligibility given this year.** We are currently revising the GATE identification process and handbook FUSD will have an update by Spring 2021.

During the 2020/21 school year we will continue to identify 5th and 6th grade students who were not identified in an earlier grade. These students may be considered for GATE identification through the professional judgement process. [Teachers](#) (*staff only*) and/or [parents](#) may nominate a student. A completed nomination form must be submitted by the teacher or parent to the school Principal by **December 11, 2020**.

Principals will set up meetings with the teacher, student, and parent to discuss the student's eligibility for GATE identification.

In June 2021, parents, teachers, and students who applied for professional judgement will be informed of their child's GATE eligibility.

- ☑ The artwork must be original and should not include any copyrighted characters such as Pokémon, Disney characters, etc.

- ☑ The design should be colored. Please trace your final design with a black Sharpie pen and make a few sketch copies before coloring, in case coloring fails. You can also scan the sketch design first and use coloring apps with computer. Please try to use our school color blue as the background color.

Our school population of approximately 620. We are proud of our rich ethnic diversity and vital, involved parental base; more than half of households have an adult whom has attended graduate school.

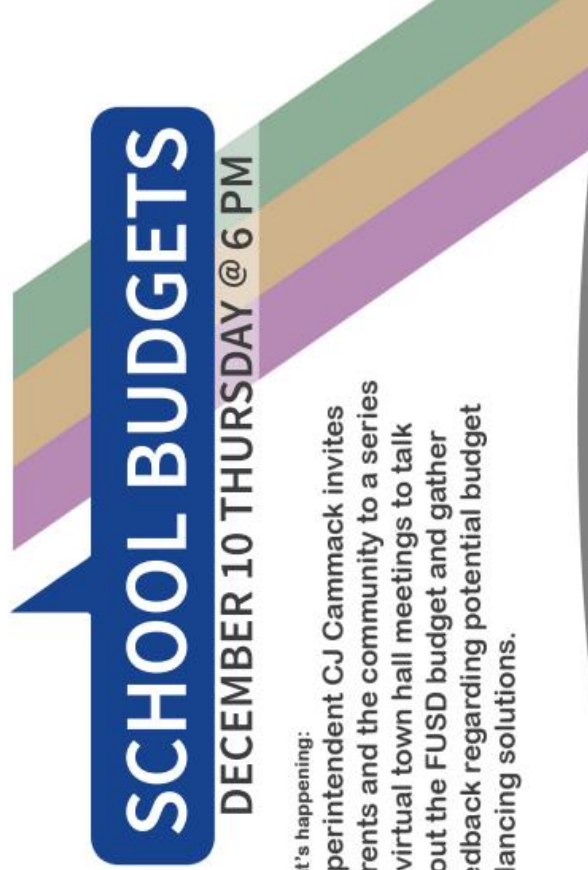

Dear Parent/Guardian:

During the 2020-21 school year, your child will be assessed a total of three times to help determine areas where they may need additional support. These district assessments, along with other classroom assessments, will be used to identify students who may have experienced significant learning loss due to distance learning in the 2019-20 school year, as well measure student progress of this year's course standards to identify students who are at risk of experiencing learning loss due to distance learning.

The first of these three assessments was administered during the month of October. School sites are currently analyzing data collected from Assessment 1 to determine classroom and other interventions that may need to be implemented for specific students. The Assessment 1 tests were based on students' previous year content standards in English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics.

Parents/guardians currently have access to Assessment 1 results via the [Illuminate Parent Portal](#). Grade 6-12 Mathematics results are not in the Illuminate Parent Portal - please contact your child's teacher for assessment results. If you do not have access to the Illuminate Parent Portal, please contact your child's school office. The results of this assessment will not be used for grading purposes and will be excluded from report card grades.

Assessments 2 and 3 will focus on your child's current grade level content standards taught up to that point in time. **The testing windows will be as follows:**

- Kindergarten - Grade 5
 - o ELA, Assessment 2: November 30, 2020 - December 11, 2020
 - o Mathematics, Assessment 2: January 6, 2021 - January 27, 2021
 - o ELA and Mathematics, Assessment 3: March 2021, dates TBD
- Grade 6 - Grade 12:
 - o ELA, Assessment 2: November 30, 2020 - December 11, 2020
 - o Mathematics, Assessment 2: January 25, 2021 - February 5, 2021
 - o ELA and Mathematics, Assessment 3: March 2021, dates TBD
